DOGS ON THE COURSE - POLICY EXTRACT

On Thursday there were some bunkers with numerous deep dog prints in the sand. A player's ball came to rest in one of those deep prints. Whilst a dog is in the Club grounds it is to be *under control* at all times and this may require the dog to be on a leash.



Dogs are to be kept away from tee-blocks, greens and bunkers. Any interference to bunker surfaces is to be raked smooth. Dog faeces are to be picked up and removed from the golf course by those controlling the dog. This includes the course general area. Should a breach of these policy requirements be seen by a Club Member it should be reported to the Club Shop.

Know your Golf Rules - Today's Topic: Rule 4.1a - don't put things on the face of your clubs

Whilst testing clubs or being custom fit, the pro may place tracker dots or fiducials on the face of the club to give an indication of performance. You might think these are so minimal as to make no difference if you were to leave them on. You might be right, but you can't leave them on the face according to The Rules. These stickers are considered to be able to change the club's playing characteristics, making it non-conforming and in contravention of Rule 4.1a. If you make a stroke with a club that has fiducials left on, you will be disqualified.

Do not leave any markings or stickers on the face of your clubs.
