RULES

On the 16th hole you play your tee shot into the dense bush on the left (not a penalty area). You therefore announce that you will play a provisional. You play your provisional but it too goes into the dense bush but you hear a solid noise and suspect that your ball hit a solid branch. However you think it is safer if you play a second provisional ball and put it on the green. When you get to the bush area you find your first provisional and your original ball is deemed to be lost. You decide to hit the first provisional ball and do so. How many strokes and penalties would that be after playing the first provisional?

That will be one for the tee shot, one penalty shot for the lost ball, one for the provisional tee shot, and one shot for your approach onto the green. Four shots.
