RULES OF GOLF NOT UNDERSTOOD - TAKING RELIEF

When dropping from a path or other immovable obstruction, many people mistakenly believe that they're entitled to a perfect lie and line but this is not the case. You are only getting relief from that specific immovable obstruction or abnormal course condition, so if the relief area measured from your nearest point of complete relief takes you unavoidably into thick rough, a bush or behind a tree, that is where you have to drop if you elect to take free relief as there is no free relief from such elements in the general area.

Remember, it's 'nearest' not 'nicest' point of complete relief - the location of that spot is not negotiable and you are not guaranteed a perfect lie or line.
