PENNANTS AT NORTHLAND GOLF CLUB

Sun 15 Feb: There will be an 18 - Hole Pennants event on this Sun for 60 players (15 groups of four). Play will start at 10:30 am for a multi-tee start on 1,5,8,10, and 14. The course will not close down however there will be some restrictions. Precedence is to be given to the Pennants teams and a marshal will be present to address any difficulties. Play should be complete by 3 pm after which the teams will gather upstairs in the bar. Golfers will be able to commence a round during Pennants play but starting will be controlled by the Club Shop.

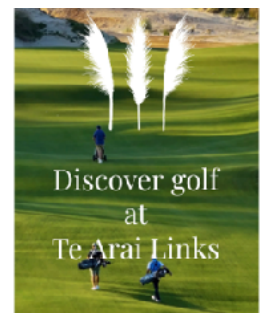
Sun 22 Feb: There will be a 36 - Hole Pennants event on for 24 players (6 groups of four). Play will start at 8:30 am on tees yet to be confirmed. There may be some restrictions on general play. Precedence is to be given to the Pennants teams and a marshal will be present to address any difficulties. Play should be complete by 5 pm after which the teams will gather upstairs in the bar. Golfers will be able to commence a round during Pennants play but starting will be controlled by the Club Shop.

NORTH GOLF HOTPRINTZ TEAM AMBROSE SERIES

During the first four months of 2026 a series of qualifier rounds will be held by 10 different Northland Clubs after which a regional qualifier will be held by North Golf. The competition will include 3-person teams of men or women or mixed. The winners of each Club qualifier will go forward to the regional final and compete to be the ones to play in the Grand Final at Te Arai Golf Club. Second place-getters will take the place of the winners if players are later unable to field a team that played in the Club qualifiers.

A poster and the rules will be released in next week's Tee Times and media platforms.

KNOW YOUR GOLF RULES

After the Round - Scorecard Responsibilities

You haven't finished your round when you hole out at the 18th - you must now deal with checking and returning your scorecard. Returning your score is an integral part of game but is also possibly the most frustrating way to be penalised or DQ'd if done incorrectly. You must return your card without "undue delay" so this should be the first job you do after leaving the 18th green. Also, once your card has been handed in it is "final" and cannot be changed.

It has been noted that some players choose not to submit a good or bad card so as to create some control over changes to your handicap. Please note that after each round it is required that your signed and competed card is handed in for handicapping and results recording purposes. Your handicap must reflect your actual skills level so ensure you put your completed card in.
